



Steps to Remote Learning

1. Follow your Block Timetable, Log on to the Googleclassroom for the timetabled subject.
2. Complete assigned work on Googleclassroom during the timetabled period
3. Submit work to teachers
4. Log on to subject meetings/tutorials as arranged by teachers

Remote Learning Student Expectations



Riverdale Community College Remote Learning is designed to give students an engaging online learning experience that includes clear expectations and outcomes for each week. These expectations will include online and offline learning activities. The work for each class can be found in the subjects Google Classroom. Tools in Google Classroom such as instructional videos, live and recorded sessions and online resources will be used. Not all components will be used in every class.

It is important that students understand their responsibility as learners to engage in their classrooms each day following their remote learning block timetable and log on to each subject's online meetings as arranged by their teacher. In addition, they are responsible for the same regulations as listed in the schools Code of Behaviour. This includes appropriate online behavior within the Learning Platform.

Students will:

- Create a space and dedicate time for learning based on their block timetable
- Break up the day to be their productive best
- Seek help when needed (teachers, guidance, principals)
- Create balance by taking opportunities to work offline and upload tasks
- Sign into the classrooms daily as per timetable- keep connected
- Use Google Calendar to organize classes
- Demonstrate learning with completion of assignments

- Engage with the classroom and use tools (like headphones) to focus on instructional videos, etc.
- Communicate with your teacher and examine feedback at subject meetings
- Follow the Code of Behaviour
- Demonstrate online learning etiquette
- Reach out to your teachers if you are overwhelmed
- Collaborate with peers using respectful language and behaviors
- Use equipment as outlined in the Acceptable Use Policy.
- Wear attire acceptable for school
- Support each other in this new way of learning
- Be patient with yourselves and your teachers- we are all learning together!
